## 6 add 9 Chords

You may see 6 add 9 chords written as $6 / 9$. For example, C6add9 is the same thing as C6/9. Either of those spellings can be used, depending on your preference.

The same way you create add 9 chords by starting with triad chords, you can also make 6 add 9 chords the same way. The fastest way to add a 9th interval to a 6th chord is to find an octave of the root note in your chord shape and raise it up a whole step for an add 9 , or a half step up for an add $b 9$.

The following chord formulas are6 add 9 chords found in the Major Scale.
